

"C": John Pickle of Fredericksburgh, late Private in the Royal Yorkers, prays that the additional Bounty may be assigned him. He appears to have received 100 acres for himself, 250 acres for a wife and four children, being his proportion under the Instructions of 1783. Having duly improved the same, a certificate is granted him for the Bounty.

"C": Peter Asselstine of Ernest Town, late Private in the Loyal Rangers, prays that 500 acres of land may be assigned him. As he had no family at the first distribution of Family Lands, his right under the Instructions of 1783 is reduced to 100 acres only which he has received, and having duly improved the same, a certificate is further granted for the additional Bounty.

"C": John Asselstine of Ernest Town, late private in the Loyal Rangers, prays that 450 acres of land may be assigned him. Mr. Asselstine's family consisting of a wife only at the first distribution of lands, [he] can be entitled only to 150 acres of land under the Instructions of 1783. These he has already received and duly improved; a certificate is therefore granted him for the additional Bounty only.

"C": Isaac Asselstine of Ernest Town, Loyalist, prays that the additional Bounty may be assigned him. Under the Instructions of 1783, he hath received 100 acres and hath resided with his father, Peter Asselstine, without improving his own location, on which account the Board decline giving him the Bounty.

"C": Joseph Prindle of Fredericksburgh, late private in the King's Rangers, prays that 350 acres may be assigned him. Mr. Prindle's family at the first distribution of Family Lands consisted of a wife and four children, which entitled him under the Instructions of 1783 to 350 acres. This he has received and is further entitled to the Bounty only, for which a certificate is granted him.

"C": Doctor Prindle of Fredericksburgh, late private in the King's Rangers, prays that 300 acres may be assigned him. He hath received 100 acres, being his proportion under the Instructions of 1783, and is further entitled to the additional Bounty only, for which a certificate is granted him.

"C": Jacob Carpenter, late of Kingsbury in the State of New York, prays to be admitted as an inhabitant of this district. Gilbert Harns, late of the King's Rangers, informs the Board that he is well acquainted with Carpenter and his family, who were Loyalists, and that he had a brother who served in the Loyal Rangers, but was himself too young to bear arms. The Board grant him a certificate for 200 acres of land after administering the oath of allegiance.

"C": John Baker of Adolphus Town prays that 300 acres of land may be assigned him. By certificate from Capt. Peter Rattan, it appears that Mr. Baker served as a non-commissioned officer in the New Jersey Volunteers, and was consequently entitled to 200 acres under the Instructions of 1783. He appears to have received 100 acres only, which he has duly improved; a certificate is therefore granted him for 300 acres.

"C": William Shuman of Fredericksburgh, late private in the Royal Yorkers, prays that the additional Bounty may be assigned him. Mr. Shuman has received 100 acres for himself and 200 acres for a wife and three children, being his proportion under the Instructions of 1783, and having made due improvements thereon, a certificate is granted him for the Bounty.
